

Indianapolis Region Demographics

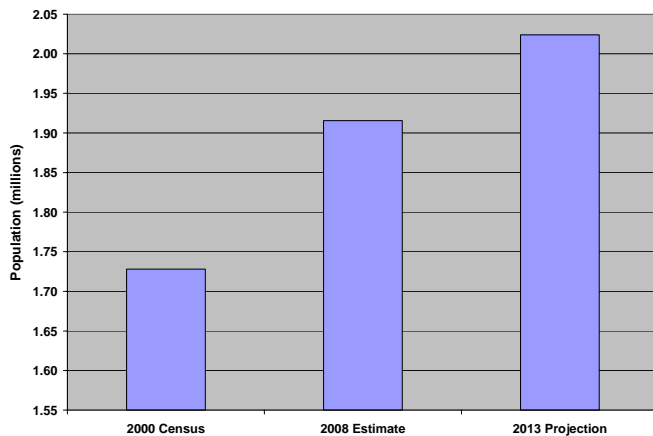
