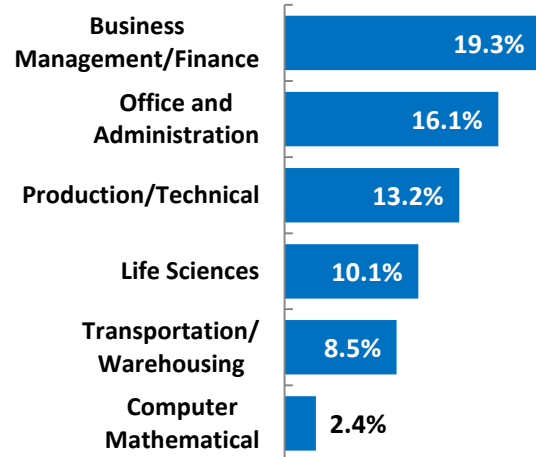


Indianapolis Region Workforce



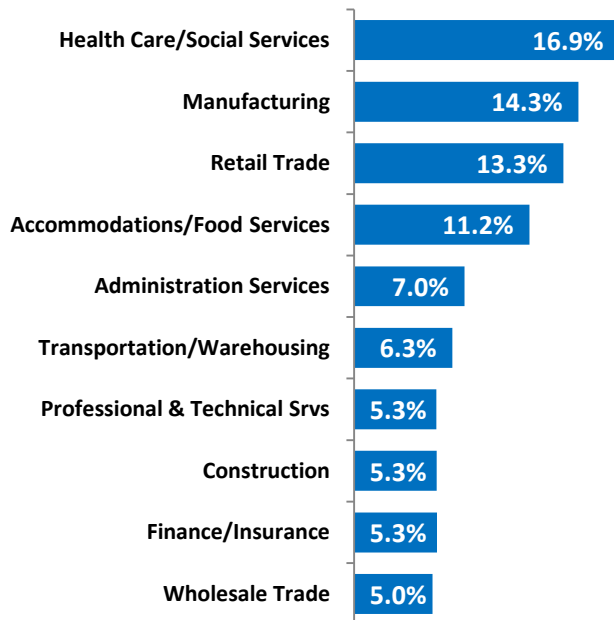
